Dr. Gyula Hajnóczi

Gyula Hajnóczi, Ph. D., Dr. Sci. Techn., professor. Born in Baja, Hungary, on April 5, 1920, he passed secondary school examination in 1938. He made university studies in Sopron, Pécs, Kolozsvár and Budapest (in theology, Italian and Hungarian language and literature, history of arts, architecture, archaeology) totalling 20 semesters. In 1950 he graduated as an architect, and in 1958 as an archaeologist. He was granted the Ph. D. degree in 1961, and the Dr. Techn. degree in 1966, accessory to the degree Cand. Techn. Sci. In 1978 he was granted the degree Dr. Techn. Sci.

At the Institute of History and Theory of Architecture, TUB, (and at its predecessor department) he acted 1949 to 1950 as demonstrator, 1950 to 1955 as assistant, 1955 to 1961 as senior assistant, 1961 to 1978 as associate professor, 1978 to 1990 as professor. In 1990 he retired. 1973 to 1986 he was vice-director of the Institute, and head of the Section of History of Architecture. 1978 to 1981 he was vice-dean of the Faculty of Architecture. Since his retirement in 1990, he has been delivering in regular and postgraduate education in monuments preservation.

His scientific domains include history of architecture of antiquity and of provincial Roman architecture, and the theory of architectural spaces. In these scopes he has published several books and papers in both Hungarian and foreign periodicals.

As a vice-dean, he initiated summer camps of monument surveying and hand-drawing for students. Actually, he directs students of architecture in experiments on space sensation and on elements of spatial effects.

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
